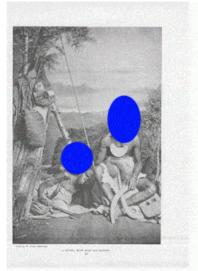

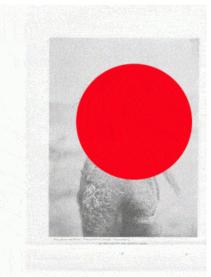

- 3. Let your mind and senses swim.



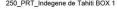

## Want to know more about Brook?

Most recently he presented What's Left Behind, a new commission for SUPERPOSITION: Art of Equilibrium and Engagement, the 21<sup>st</sup> Biennale of Sydney. In 2017 he created an intervention into the collection of the Musée d'ethnographie de Genève, Switzerland; presented Ahy-kon-uh-klas-tik, an interrogation of the Van Abbemuseum archives in The Netherlands; undertook a Smithsonian Artist Research Fellowship, with the Smithsonian Institute, USA; and The Right to Offend is Sacred opened at the National Gallery of Victoria, a 25-year reflection on his practice.

His current research includes an ambitions international comparative three-year Federal Government Australian Research Council grant titled Representation, Remembrance and the Memorial. The project is designed to respond to the repeated high-level calls for a national memorial to Aboriginal loss and the frontier wars: www.rr.memorial.

Brook Andrew is represented by Tolarno Galleries, Melbourne; Roselyn Oxley9 Gallery, Sydney; and Gallery Nathalie Obadia, Paris and Brussels.
